West Dayton Food Access Collective Impact Project Who this Project Helps

- 1. Residents of West Dayton food desert neighborhoods will be served as consumers of nutritious and affordable fresh food
- 2. West Dayton organizations will be served as local food producers, market operators, and distributors
- 3. Un/under-employed West Dayton residents will be served as job training participants and labor work crews







West Dayton Food Access Collective Impact Project The Goals

- 5 West Dayton community and school-based gardens revitalized or built (4)
- 15 participants trained and provided direct labor to gardens and markets (24)
- **100** customers served at West Dayton food events and pop-up markets **(105)**
- 386 Gem City Market grocery co-op shares sold to W. Dayton residents (*291)
- •555 SNAP-EBT customers served at The Market at Wright Stop Plaza and 2nd St. Market (353)
- **15,000** pounds of food produced, distributed, or sold **(7,174)**







West Dayton Food Access Collective Impact Project The Goals

- **50** youth attending out-of-school meal programs
- 90 participants attending nutrition and cooking education in church and community center food kitchens
- 100 W. Dayton residents participate in Leadership Development & Training
- **381** participate at W. Dayton education and awareness events (ex: Urban Food & Health Fair)




